Road journey on narrow, bendy, coast road.	All	Adherence to minibus operating procedures.	
Car Park - busy at peak times	All on foot crossing car park to toilets/ Visitors Centre/Picnic area	Allow sufficient time for a slow journey especially in busy holiday periods and tourist months.	
Biting insects especially mosquitoes, horse flies in warmer months.	All	Issue safety warning as necessary.	
Sunburn/cold	All	Give warnings about covering up to prevent stings. Check allergy sufferers have taken action to prevent/treat any bites.	
Titchwell beach depending upon sea / tide / weather state / activity to be undertaken if other than guided walk.	All	Issue guidance on the need to cover up, apply sun cream, take hats etc. in summer and wrap up well in winter.	
Picnic with dirty hands especially if handling biotic material	All	Guidance given on where to go, what to do / not to do as appropriate to group / tide state / activity	
Eye damage if binoculars used to look into the sun	All	Issue guidance on necessity of hand washing as necessary
